Federal Consolidated Grant-Funded Programs:

Title IA	Provides support for academically underperforming students. These funds are currently utilized by the District's "schoolwide" schools: Gannett Peak Elementary (grades KG-3), Baldwin Creek Elementary (grades 4-5), Lander Middle School (grades 6-8) and the alternative school Pathfinder High School (grades 9-12).
Title ID	Provides support for neglected and delinquent youth. These funds are utilized for the District's drop-out prevention programs and tutoring services.
Title IIA	Provides support for teacher quality/professional development. These funds are utilized to assist staff with meeting school improvement goals through professional development opportunities.
Title VIB	Provides support for students with special education needs. These funds are utilized for students that have been identified as having special education needs in grades Pre-K through 12.
Perkins	Provides support for career-technical education (CTE) programs. These funds are utilized for CTE programs that are part of a program of study.

Other Grant-Funding:

21st Century: Lights On!	Lights On! Center offers expanded learning opportunities toward academic excellence and positive youth development, in a safe and structured environment - particularly for low-performing students who need extra support academically and socially, or who need a safe place outside school hours. Services for students and families include before and after school - and summer - programming.
Title VII: Native American Program	Supports a district-wide Johnson-O'Malley Native American Liaison, and financially assists efforts designed to meet the specialized and unique educational needs of eligible Indian students. These may include programs supplemental to the regular school program and support, where necessary to maintain educational goals and standards.
