## CHAPTER 1

## WYOMING CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

**Section 1. Authority.** These rules are promulgated by the Wyoming State Board of Education pursuant to W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iv).

## Section 2. Certificate of Completion Requirements.

- (a) Each school district shall provide students with disabilities whose IEP team places the student on extended standards pursuant W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iii), the opportunity to receive a certificate of completion.
- (i) Requirements for earning a certificate of completion shall be written by the IEP team into a four-year plan and attached to the student's IEP.
- (ii) Requirements for earning a certificate of completion shall be unique to each student and consistent with the student's IEP but are not dependent upon meeting all IEP or IEP transition goals.
- (iii) Requirements for earning a certificate of completion shall be developed during the IEP transition planning in grade eight or upon high school enrollment if not already established for transfer students.
- (iv) The plan for receiving a Certificate of Completion must be signed by the student's parent/guardian and reviewed annually at the student's annual IEP team meeting.
- (v) If a student awarded a Certificate of Completion is less than twenty-one (21) years of age, the student has a continued right to attend public school until the end of the school year in which the student reaches age twenty-one (21) or until the student has earned a high school diploma, whichever is earlier.
- (vi) A Certificate of Completion is a certificate option and not recognized as a high school diploma under state law.
- (b) Each school district shall have a certificate of completion policy which requires the district to provide the option for the student who has completed the requirements for receiving a certificate of completion as articulated in his/her four-year plan within his/her IEP to participate in graduation ceremonies relative to their graduating peers.
